




Desert Bighorn Sheep: Wilderness Icon is the most comprehensive photographic work ever published on this iconic symbol of the deserts of the southwest United States and northern Mexico. Over 200 high-quality photographs depict the elusive desert bighorn as never seen before in their rugged desert habitat. It is a tour de force showing rare behavior, ewes nurturing newborn lambs, and massive rams in stunning ritualized combat for dominance. Written in an engaging style, it will appeal to both scientist and layman alike.



Mark C. Jorgensen has spent five decades studying and tracking desert bighorn sheep throughout their range. In his 36-year career in California State Parks, he has served as a state park ranger, a resource ecologist, and as superintendent of Anza-Borrego Desert State Park. He is currently a member of the technical staff of the Desert Bighorn Council, Inc. and is an advisor to the Bighorn Institute. As a hunter who chooses not to hunt bighorn, he understands the tension between conservation and preservation of bighorn sheep.



Jeff Young has been an avid photographer for over 40 years. After retiring from a career in advertising and sales, Young's photography has concentrated on wildlife, and since 2008, his focus has been on desert bighorn sheep. He has taken thousands of photographs of bighorns, documenting their behavioral activity, including rarely-seen affectionate, playful, and sometimes violent behaviors. His photographs have been exhibited in Borrego Springs and at the San Diego Natural History Museum.
