Sean Stackpoole Jazz Quartet Concert

Saturday September 14, 4 pm

Steeped in the tradition of the great jazz era of the late 1950's and early 1960's, the quartet's music looks simultaneously back to the tradition of straight-ahead jazz and forward to the jazz of the future.

The Sean Stackpoole Quartet performs regularly throughout the eastern Sierra as well as at the hottest jazz clubs in Los Angeles. The quartet members are Sean Stackpoole, saxophone, Ron Berman, guitar, Blake White, upright bass, and Evan Pouchak, drums.



Sean is an exceptionally talented performer who is equally at home in both the jazz and classical worlds. He plays saxophone and flute on his debut CD "What's New". This CD, available at the concert, is straight-ahead jazz and contains both traditional jazz standards and original works. Sean has also authored the saxophone method book "Saxophone Basix" published by Alfred Publishing and has performed at the Monterey Jazz Festival and toured Japan. He has also performed with Joe Labarbara, Putter Smith, Eric Reed, Chris Dawson, Rita Moreno, Steve Allen, Bill Berry and Jack Sheldon. Sean is a founding member of the City of Angeles Saxophone Quartet, which performed at the museum in January during the last concert season.

With all the shake, rattle, and roll, I am pleased to report that there was very little damage in curation. One of the bird displays did fall apart; however, only one of the prepared mounts was seriously damaged. There is a lot to be said for the use of museum wax, even on shelving. A new bird display will be up soon.

As we slide into fall, be mindful of our wild creatures also preparing for fall and winter. Birds are moving south so providing water and full feeders will help them along.

The ravens will also take advantage of the opportunity to pillage, so keep trash cans covered and encourage neighbors and businesses to do the same. Also keep pet food where they can't get into it. My outdoor cat has to be fed after dark to keep the ravens out of the barn were the food is put out. Yes, the birds do boldly entered the barn to help themselves.

To keep pesky ants out of hummingbird feeders use cooking spray (like Pam) on the feeder stand or the top of the feeder; it doesn't take much and hot water will wash the residue off during cleaning.
